- **Okemah Community Hospital -** \$53,000,000.00  
Hospital is open to the public. Completed 2018
- **Eufaula Clinic -** Serves all Native American tribes. \$26,000,000.00  
Completed 2018
- **Okmulgee Community Hospital –** Upgrades, remodel in some areas, \$2,000,000.00  
Demolition of and replacing all parking lots.  
New Okmulgee ER Entry -  
Construction started in 2018 and is ongoing
- **Koweta Pharmacy Refill Center -** \$2,500,000.00  
Construction started 7/15/19 expected completion 4/15/20
- **Reintegration Facility-Henryetta -** \$6,000,000.00  
Provides room and board for Native American clients released from  
prison. They provide a variety of training and counseling and many  
other services to assist clients in a smooth transition into society.
- **Cromwell Community Center renovation and addition -** \$ 800,000.00  
Completed 2017
- **Okemah Community Center and Elderly Nutrition -** \$1,200,000.00

- **Transportation Maintenance Building -** \$1,122,567.01  
Completed 2018
  
- **Hanna Community Center -** \$1,200,000.00  
Completed 2019
  
- **Phase II Mound Renovation, Auditorium and HVAC -** \$ 850,000.00  
Completed 2019
  
- **Several Demolition projects.** \$ 350,000.00  
These projects are important, abandoned structures become a liability and life safety threat to the public. Demolition projects from 2018 to 2020 include several houses, mobile-home park and hospital.

The above listed projects total: **\$95,022,567.01**
